Here are recent reports received of God’s love growing through your mites:

A Rising Need, A Spiritual Opportunity (\$10,000): Lutheran Special Education Ministries help God’s children with learning differences.

Blessings in a Backpack (\$7,000) helped feed 115 children weekly with personal notes, invitations to church-sponsored events, and food to nourish minds, bodies, and souls for the Lord.

Christ Lutheran Mission (\$8,800): welcomed an outdoor shelter to better serve

those in need in their community.

Feed the Children—Peru

(\$5,000) are feeding 275 children three weekly brunches while learning about the love of Jesus. (Moms help prepare and serve)



Filling Haitian Children Spiritually and Physically (\$10,000) helped Trinity Hope share the Gospel and fill empty tummies throughout the 265 Christian schools with whom they partner.

Food & Clothing Co-op, Concordia Theological Seminary, Ft. Wayne

(\$5,000) helped provide fresh produce, milk, eggs, and butter, and other perishable and non-perishable items, to our future church workers and their families.



COUNSELOR'S CORNER**JR. COUNSELOR— Rev. Dana Narring****God's Love Blooms. Bloom Where You Are Planted**

As we enter into this time of Spring when all things begin anew, we look forward to when things will again begin to bloom. Have you ever heard the phrase, “Bloom Where You Are Planted?” It’s a very positive, encouraging, and uplifting statement.

This statement almost sounds biblical. However, you may be surprised to learn that it isn’t contained in any bible verse. The earliest mention of this phrase is credited to The Bishop of Geneva, Saint Francis de Sales, who lived from 1567 to 1622. He is credited with the following: “Truly charity has no limit; for the love of God has been poured into our hearts by His Spirit dwelling in each one of us, calling us to a life of devotion and inviting us to bloom in the garden where He has planted, and directing us to radiate the beauty and spread the fragrance of His Providence.” As redeemed Christians, by the blood of Christ, who have heard the saving word of Christ, we certainly can agree that *“the love of God has been poured into our hearts through His Holy Spirit dwelling in each one of us.”*

So, what emerges from the word of Christ being planted/dwelling in us, (*yes, the “Word made Flesh” – God’s love in Christ Jesus, living in us*)? Simply put, we grow in our love for God in Christ Jesus. And yet, dear Friends in Christ, this word of God’s that has been poured-out/planted into our hearts through the Holy Spirit sometimes may appear to germinate and grow in our hearts and minds almost imperceptibly. However, God’s word is always alive and is always growing in us through the work of God’s Holy Spirit.

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him (Col 3:16) helps us see this process. God’s word, living in us, empowers us to know and to follow Christ and God’s Spirit continues to daily sanctify us.

And so it is, being firmly rooted in Christ, we continue to grow, teach, and sing to others about our faith in Christ – always giving thanks and praise to God for His love and for all that He has done for us.

God’s word is also clear . . . that being rooted in Christ is more than just our receiving and embracing God’s gracious gift of our Savior, Jesus. For we are Ambassadors in Christ – allowing the fragrance of God’s love to cover us and then, (*from all we think, say, and do*), allowing that fragrance to be transported and permeate into the hearts and minds of others as God’s Holy Spirit then creates and restores faith in others.

Dear Friends, God’s love will only bloom as we live in His love, and then share His joy with others. May the love of Christ dwelling in us allow us to do just that – today and always!

Have you seen your zone or group bylaws recently? Do we need to put a picture of your zone bylaws on a “Missing” poster? Occasionally I hear from a group or zone leader who can’t track theirs down. With that in mind, I’m collecting bylaws from groups and zones so we have them all in one place. I have some copies, but definitely not all. Take a look around and see if you can find yours, and mail or email a copy to me.

While you’re looking, here are some things to think about.

Bylaw changes take a while to go through the process, so if you’re considering some updates, starting early is always good.

To make changes to zone bylaws, start with your zone Board. The zone board should agree on any changes. Next, the zone submits their

bylaws to the Structure Chair for approval. After approval, the bylaws are presented to the zone to be approved. This usually happens at a rally. You will want to give your individual groups time to review the changes, so send them to each group in your zone about 60 days before the rally where you intend to vote on them. Add up all that time, and you should get started 4-6 months before a rally.

When you send your bylaws to me for review, please send them by email as a Word attachment.

If you aren’t sure what should be in your bylaws, I have some samples from LWML.org that I can share with you. They’re a great place to start.

Bylaws don’t sound very interesting, but they are a valuable resource for your group or zone if something comes up that you don’t know how to handle. Often your bylaws will address the issue. They’re a valuable resource so everyone knows what the rules are and how things work, so be sure to share them!




