Lenten Greetings to my Peace family,

Before we enter the special season of Lent we gather for our annual potato pancake supper on February 13th. Rita Cowan is coordinating the supper this year and is looking for volunteers to help, before during and after. The sign-up sheets are on the large bulletin board in the fellowship hall. Last year was one of our biggest to date, let's see if we can make this one even bigger and better, invite your friends and neighbors.

Our Lenten season then begins the next day on Ash Wednesday. Our mid-week sermon series is entitled "Return to the Lord." We will be using Old Testament lessons to see how God calls to his children through the prophets of old. In the midst of plagues and slavery God called to his people. house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

President Garry Kurth called the meeting to order and Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes: The following additions or corrections were made to the minutes from the December meeting:

2. Correction in spelling under New Business: "Purchase of new safe" – from "Century" to "Sentry".
3. Under Financial Secretary: The amount moved from the General Fund to the Dinner Fund (profits from the Pancake Supper and the Spaghetti Supper) was \$1,784.50, making the total profit from our dinners in 2017 \$2,490.50.

Hope Kurth made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected; Seconded by Linda Williams. Motion passed.

President's Comments: Garry Kurth welcomed everyone and looks forward to the year ahead as we do work for the Lord.

Financial Secretary: Becky Williams provided the Fund Summary for December and the Fund Summary for 2017 and both were accepted.

Treasurer: Rita Cowan provided the report. Discussion held and the treasurer's report was accepted.

Scrip: Becky reported a deposit was made for the January Scrip orders of \$2,738.00

Elders: There are now three Elders and in February they will begin having monthly meetings on the first Monday of every month at 6 P.M.

Pastor: Pastor thanked everyone for taking care of our expenses and again thanked James Spiegelberg for the purchase of the Shepherd's Staff Program. Pastor will be attending a NALIP class (National Association of Lutheran Interim Pastors) from February 5-9.

NEW BUSINESS:

Shrove Tuesday Potato Pancake Supper February 13, 2018: Rita Cowan will chair this event, but lots of help is needed! Cost: \$8.00 per Serving from 4-7 P.M. Becky will print the tickets. Signup sheets will be placed on the bulletin board.

Rummage Sale: Becky Williams made a motion to hold the Rummage Sale on Saturday, April 7th; Seconded by Linda Ryun. Motion passed.

Spaghetti Supper: Becky Williams made a motion to hold the Spaghetti Supper on Saturday, May 19th; Seconded by Doug O'Hara. Motion passed.

Oktoberfest: Becky Williams made a motion to hold the Oktoberfest on Saturday, September 22nd; Seconded by Doug O'Hara. Motion passed.

Maps of Dunnellon: The Chamber had new maps of Dunnellon printed, and Becky Williams recommended you stop by the Chamber of Commerce and pick up one. Cost \$1.00

Parish Nursing: Don Conner asked if we have a program here and said he was interested in checking into the program for Peace.

Thrivent: Dennis Witzgall asked if our congregation has a contact person here at Peace. He reminded us that all members of Thrivent can receive up to \$250 two times a year for an event that will help the community.

New Picture Directory of our Peace Family: James Spiegelberg commented it was time for an updated version, and volunteered to work on

it. Linda Ryun will again be taking pictures for this directory.

Hope Kurth made a motion to adjourn, Yvonne Conner seconded. The meeting was adjourned with prayer and the singing of the Doxology.

TURN TRASH INTO CASH!

I wanted to let you know we have collected another 30 pounds or so of ink jet cartridges and cell phones, etc. that I am going to send out this week! As you know, LWML FL-GA District is recycling electronics to raise funds to co-host our 2019 National Convention in Mobile, AL. The District goal was to make about \$7,000, but we have already exceeded that number! If you haven’t heard, we collect *empty inkjet printer cartridges, empty laser printer cartridges, used cell phones,*

laptops, digital cameras, e-Readers, tablets, GPS systems, and Scientific Calculators (include power cords for everything you donate if you can, please). If you are still working, ask if you can take the empty cartridges for your church recycling program. Place your contributions in the inkjet recycling box on the “recycle/info table” in the Fellowship Hall, and we’ll take care of them. If your laptop still has the hard drive in it, you can give it directly to me, and I will remove the hard drive and return it to you. Tablets you can reset to factory settings. For cameras; make sure your photo cards are removed.
