Terry McKee. Guest: Jennifer Rochette. President Sheryl Lutz called the meeting to order. Pastor McKee opened the meeting with prayer.

Correspondence: A Thank You letter from Military Biblestick for our donation of \$850.00

Minutes: Bud K. made a motion to accept the April 11 2016 minutes.

Linda Williams seconded the motion. The minutes were accepted.

Treasurers Report: Accepted.

Financial Secretary: Accepted.

Trustees: Accepted. Vic Rochette then submitted his resignation and left the meeting.

Pastor/Elders' Report: Pastor Terry advised that he have one more class next week. There will be no Bible Study class next week. He also stated that when we put people in church volunteer positions, that we give them the training and encouragement to do their job. Bible Stick. The Spaghetti Dinner is on track. A sign-up sheet will be posted for members to make/bring desserts. Pastor brought up all the hard work Chet and Dianne Rochette did during the winter months. It was requested that the Secretary, Jan Barker, send the Rochette's a "Thank You" note.

New Business: Rita Cowan will be ordering the new copier from Xerox. Xerox will take the old machine. Thrivent will be having a "shredding" event in Tampa this Saturday.

President's Report: Sheryl thanked everyone for all that they do, both seen and unseen, for the church. She also reminded us that she is still looking for a Vice President.

The meeting was adjourned with the singing of the Doxology.

WHAT IF WE TOLD THEM?

WE KNOW TWO THINGS:

- (1) The United States has become one of the greatest mission fields in the world as the statistic for the "unchurched" grows at a staggering rate.
- (2) Jesus commanded His disciples to proclaim a message of repentance and forgiveness of sins to the ends of the earth, starting from the heart of the local city. But what about little old me in my daily life. Does the thought of "being prepared to make a defense send chills down your spine? Take heart. You've been equipped to tell others the Good News of Jesus Christ, the reason for your hope. You know how to confess your faith, and practice it every week. The whole Christian Church confesses the ancient creeds handed down to us. Yes, the very creeds and confession of faith that you vowed to confess are at the core of bearing witness to Christ.

"But how do I use it?" you ask. It doesn't have to be staged or confrontational. It's not a debate. It's a confession that flows naturally from us through His Word and Sacrament. Our witness is an act of love and

mercy for the very people that God has placed into our lives.

How do I witness to my neighbor?

Just as we are told to love our neighbor, there are many possibilities to know and help them in our daily lives. We can witness to all that God has done in our lives, but don't be surprised if they seem guarded. We must build trust and establish relationships to get to know the real person, which helps to understand how to witness to them. Divorce, the death of a loved one, world suffering, all lead to a closing of ears to the Word. The Good News is that you don't need to answer for God. As Christians, we know we face tribulation in this sin-broken world. And yet God in His mercy sent His Son to make all things new. We know the cross is the greatest picture of the depths of God's love, that His Son suffered the consequences of our sins, bore our transgressions in His own flesh, and carried our cross on His own shoulders. We are drawing others into the life of the Church, where they also may receive God's Word and Sacraments for the forgiveness of sins. Where there is forgiveness, there is life and salvation, and that, my friends, is what we witness.
